From Pastor's Pen ...



"Jesus Is Our A to Z Righteousness!

"I am the Alpha and the Omega," says the Lord God, "who is the and who was and who is come, the Almighty." – Revelation 1:8

It's a trend in business not only to have memorable logos but ones that send an unconscious or subliminal message. Take a close look at the *FedEx* logo. It is short for "Federal Express". That's a mouthful that doesn't say much. So they changed it. FedEx. And they accomplished two things. First, it's catchy. It's a memorable name. Secondly, by having the letter "X" at the end; they are saying their delivery service goes anywhere in the world where you could possibly be. "X" marks the spot!

Look at Amazon's logo. It has a smile that connect the letter "A" to the letter "Z". They want you to know that you will find anything on their website from soup to nuts... or from "A" to "Z"! And if you've ever used Amazon, it's true! You find just about anything you could ever imagine.

It is interesting that no less than three times in the Book of Revelation, Jesus reveals Himself as the "Alpha" and the "Omega". Why the unusual language? Jesus is planting a memorable image in our minds. One that communicates or should communicate again and again to us. Alpha is the first letter in the Greek alphabet and Omega is the last letter of the Greek alphabet. In other words, Jesus is our "A" to "Z" Lord. He is everything that we could possibly need.

What should that mean practically for you? Jesus is your First to go to and your Last to close! He is the One who meets any and all of your needs. His work of redemption guarantees that for you. That work done on your behalf provides complete, total and perfect care in every aspect of life. His Word and Sacrament give us access total access to God. Not even "prime" membership can deliver on that!

From the beginning of life to the end; Christ our Alpha and Omega promises that He is with you. That means every single, mundane moment you can imagine. In times of trouble and frustration, Christ supports and strengthens. In grief and pain, He comforts. In moments of joy, He blesses and deepens. And when it comes to those daily needs (like back-to-school shopping) He provides all that we need. Right down to the *clothing, shoes, house and home and all that I need* that Luther talks about in his explanation to the 1st Article. In every phase, every moment and every aspect of life – you are never left to wonder if He can or He will! There's no search bar where you have to type in the key words or the UPC code. Your Heavenly Savior knows!

Jesus Your Alpha and Omega Lord, promises to find, to give and deliver all that you need as He has promised in His Word. His Word, His Work and His Love deliver all that you could possibly need for all the moments and every circumstance. In a world, where technology promises us the world...Jesus is the first Word and the last Word in this life and the life that is most certainly to come.


Fall Bible Sale




