Jesus Is Our Savior From Fear

"And the angel said to them, 'Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David, a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.'" –Luke 2:10-11

Isn't it interesting that every time angels appear, they begin with the word, "Fear not!"? What does fear have to do with Christmas? Why would people be afraid? Look at people's fears and anxieties, at this time of the year, and you see...plenty!

December and everything that goes with it produces its share of problems. We are a society more isolated than ever. And people turn to television/social media for companionship. People look at the adverts and the pictures of happy times with happy people and think; *"why can't that be me...why is everyone else happier than me?"* Depression sinks in. Christmas won't be the same because...fill in the blank: loved ones are gone, relationships are strained or distance involved or just because you think it is just a bunch of nonsense every year. *"The perfect Christmas?" That just won't happen* is what a lot of people think.

Others dread Christmas because of the cost. It's the thought of what January's bills will look like with the credit card. That list of people to buy for that keep growing. That "it" gift that everyone has to have that is sky high because it is technology. Christmas becomes an "unaffordable" luxury you can't afford; so why bother being "merry and bright"? Yes, the list goes on and on. The meals to shop for and cook, the parties to host, the difficult family member to put up with...how anxieties grow! And never far behind is the guilt and the shame that we feel.

But if you're a little anxious, look at Joseph and Mary together with the shepherds. They all felt fear. For Mary there was no welcoming, clean hospital with a birthing center and caring staff to look after her every need. There wasn't a midwife even to coach her, reassure her that all would be ok. Only the darkness and smell of an animal shed.

Then there was Joseph. He married a wife who carried a baby that wasn't his own. His family and friends heard the story about how special this baby would be; how angels had told them both that this baby was God Himself. You can imagine how that went over with family and friends. Joseph, like any new father, felt so inadequate for

the task of raising a son and providing for a family. And imagine he was step father to the Son of God Himself.

Finally there are the shepherds. Their life out under the open sky was anything but easy. We enjoy camping for a while but think about cold and damp being your everyday experience. They lived isolated lives, far from family and friends. They had to sleep with one eye or ear open. They lived on the trigger, on the ready to defend the flock at a moment's notice when predators attacked. But who could prepare for what happened Christmas night? Here was an adrenalin rush of fear that overwhelmed them as they stood before powerful and mighty angels.

The point is, God knows every single worry, fear & trouble that can grip hearts & lives. As far as God is concerned, fear is not an option. He doesn't want anyone to live in fear or worry as a daily visitor. He doesn't want us to think, we've got nothing to live for or assume that our lives are just too miserable to bother with Christmas. That is why Christmas comes with an amazing command, ***"Do not be afraid!"*** To shut down, to close down or to hunker down until the season passes; is to close heart and mind to what God has prepared for you. God is pointing to life itself in that manger. Christmas isn't a parable of how life is renewed in the birth of our own children. Christmas isn't the renewal of life on this earth because babies are born. That's New Age Nonsense! God gives you life in a whole new way! Life from sin. Life from death! Life that leads to eternal life in this Savior Christ the Lord! God Himself has come in the flesh to erase everything that sin has done to us.

Ever have the fear of not measuring up? Jesus comes to destroy every past fault & every current worry. Anxious about what is happening at the moment & what the fault out will be? You don't have to do life on your own anymore! God came at Christmas into our time and space. With His almighty power, he promises you are never alone. He will be with you to the very end of your life to your final breath. He says to you: ***"I have come that they may have life and have it to the full."*** The "they" Jesus is talking about is YOU! Hear His Word. Believe His promise.

Peace comes to you as you believe & live with the understanding that Jesus is here. Not just at Christmas. But every day and every moment. ***"Do not be afraid!"*** Real help is not just on the way...real help is already here. And final deliverance to life everlasting will come. Let this joy fill your heart! A Savior is born for you...He is Christ, your Lord.

Pastor opened with a devotion.

Absent: Board of Education

Minutes: The minutes of the 2017 September meeting were reviewed. Motion was made by Phil Lewin, seconded by Scott Krause to approve. Motion Carried.

Treasurer: The quarterly statement from the funds at the LCMS Foundation were read. The end of the quarter financial statements were reviewed. A motion was made by Kirk Delwiche, seconded by Scott Krause to approve. Motion Carried.

Old Business:

Master Planning: Paul talked to the Elders, is looking to get started soon.

LED Lighting: Return might not be what is expected. This item has been tabled.

Reformation Walk: If costumes are needed talk to Candace. Decorating will take place on the day before the Walk at 9 AM. The plan is to have groups of 10 to 12 people travel to each station.

Oktoberfest Wrap up: We served around 360 people. Sold approximately 380 tickets. Our profit was \$7762. Doug is recommending that we move \$20,000. From the Oktoberfest account to the general fund.

New Business:

2017 Officer Nominations: Treasurer: Bobbi Marks, Elder: Kirk Delwiche, Trustee: Bill Mitchell, Stewardship/Evangelism: Sue Hanson, Sunday School Finance: Kathy Krause, Board of Education: Sarah Pope. Motion by Phil Lewin, seconded by Bobbi Marks to recommend these nominations to the congregation. Motion Carried.

2018 Missions: Recommend all stay at current levels. Bakers: \$3000, Peace Campus: \$1350, and WDUX approximately \$860. Motion by Bobbi Marks, second by Scott Krause. Motion Carried.

2018 Wages: Per the Elders Synod recommends a 2.4% increase. Elders have no specific guideline that they would like to follow. Recommend pastors salary for 2018 \$75000.00. Motion Bobbi Marks, second Scott Krause, Motion Carries. Recommendations for the following employees: Bonnie: \$2760.00, Jenny: \$2760.00, Linda: \$575.00, John: \$1880.00, Kim: \$12.54/hr. Motion Bobbi Marks, second Ken Rothe. Motion Carries.

Pastor: Oct. 29th is Reformation. There will be one service at 9:30 am. The walk will begin about 10:45 followed by the meal at 11:45. Pastor will begin Pre-marital counseling with Natalie Hartfiel and her fiancé. That wedding is scheduled for next September. Sunday School and Catechism are going well. The Wednesday Bible class is going well. They will be moving on to a book called The Church of our Fathers. Sunday morning is still going through Post Reformation history. In the new year they will move into the 4 gospels.

Elders: Would like to invite the Trustees to their next meeting. Went through the shut in list.

Trustees: Water filtration needs to be replaced in the kitchen. The leak over the daycare has been repaired. Exploring other options for new ceiling tile in the daycare area. An exit light in the basement is broke.

Board of Education: Daycare doing well. Sunday school will begin Christmas program practice soon.

Stewardship/Evangelism: Preparing for Reformation.

A motion was made by Bobbi Marks, seconded by Ken Rothe to adjourn. We adjourned at 7:35 pm.
