From Pastor's Pen ...



<u>Don't Miss Out On The Real Treasure of Christmas</u>

"But Mary treasured up all these things,
pondering them in her heart." –Luke 2:19

There is a principle of life that most Americans (and Christians) cherish and follow. And more than any other time of the year, this principle seems to take over at Christmas. The principle is this: *The good life is a full life*. In other words, the good life is a life packed full with as many experiences as you can possibly have. The good life is life bursting at the seams with all the experiences that life has to offer.

And this principle has a way of driving us subliminally in the run up to Christmas. We want a Christmas packed to the gills. So our December calendars quickly fill up with family get-togethers, company parties, Christmas pageants and plays, Christmas caroling, concerts, those endless trips to the mall, Christmas card writing, TV Christmas special-watching, house decorating, cookie baking, and anything else you can squeeze in.

"But we need all these things..." we think to ourselves. Really? Do we really need all the wear and tear, the stress and the credit card melt-down come January? To our way of thinking once they are a part of how we "do" Christmas, we can't say, "No." Simply because a great Christmas is a full Christmas.

Is it any wonder, then, that our Christmases are more hectic than holy, more exhausting than exhilarating, more painful than joyful? The tragedy is we have robbed ourselves of one of the most precious features of the first Christmas.

Every year we successfully recreate and remember many features of the first Christmas as we listen again to the Christmas Gospels. We recreate and remember baby Jesus, Mary, Joseph, the shepherds and angels. We recreate the stable and manger, sometimes even the animals. But there is one feature of that first Christmas we make impossible for ourselves to receive: the quiet of Christmas.

After the sounds of labor and delivery had fled into the night, quiet reigned supreme on the first Christmas, interrupted only by the angels song of praise. The remainder of that first Christmas was all about quiet and meditation. You can almost see Mary, Joseph, and the shepherds, standing and sitting there in stunned silence, meditating upon the words of the angel: <u>For unto you is born this day in the city of David, a Savior, who is Christ the Lord (Luke 2:11).</u>

Probably one of the greatest reasons "Silent Night" is so loved by many millions of people, is simply because it

expresses something we long to have but never find on our own: the quiet of Christmas. The silently, how silently the wondrous gift is given that Phillip Brooks expresses in "O Little Town of Bethlehem" is the opportunity to stop, to be quiet, and to meditate on what the birth of Jesus really means. In our silence, we can begin to be like Mary who treasured and pondered what God had done. That is one of the reasons why something stirs in our hearts when we sing of that first silent night when all was calm and all was bright.

Martin Luther, also understood the importance of quiet. He once wrote:

The Christmas Gospel is so clear that there is little need of learned interpretation. It is only necessary to ponder it well, to contemplate it, and to take it completely into your heart. None will derive more benefit from it than they whose hearts hold still and who divest themselves of material considerations and concentrate diligently on it. This lesson is just like [the reflection of] the sun: in a quiet and still pond it can be seen clearly and warms the water powerfully, but in a rushing current it cannot be seen as well nor can it warm up the water as much. So if you wish to be illumined and warmed here, to see God's mercy and wondrous deeds, so that your heart is filled with fire and light and becomes reverent and joyous, then go to where you may be still and impress the picture deep into your heart. You will find no end of wondrous deeds (LW 52:8-9).

Isn't that great advice? If you really want to experience all that Christmas is, then be quiet and still like a pond rather than a rushing stream and go running here and there. That's how you can absorb what God's treasure of His Son is all about in the Christmas Gospel. In our silence and moments of peace, the Holy Spirit works in our hearts and mind directing us to the true meaning of Christmas. That meaning will go beyond the simple truth, Christ is born. It won't stop with the truth that Christ the Savior is born. But the Holy Spirit directs us to the real comfort; that Christ the Savior is born for you, to be the antidote for your sin, to rescue you from everlasting punishment and give you everlasting life. This, as well as much more comes as we quietly ponder the treasure of His birth.

Many will continue thinking and acting as if a good life is a full life and that a good Christmas is a full Christmas. Our God disagrees. He invites us to know that a good Christmas is a quiet Christmas, a quiet Christmas spent meditating upon the riches of Christ. That will bring you lasting joy when the trappings of Christmas are long gone. That will bring you peace, the peace of Christ that passes all understanding. A blessed and quiet Christmas to everyone!
