From Pastor's Pen ...



"Search the Scripture...they bear witness about Me." John 5:39
Who...When...What...Why...And How Come?

Way back when, "back in the day" (as young people are fond of saying) grade school English class was all about answering all of the "W's you see above. Whether we were writing essays, book reports, letters or business memos; my English teachers were "eagle-eyed" when it came to content, spelling and grammar of good writing. I am thankful for the lessons all my teachers taught. Yes, even English teachers! Even if I wasn't too happy to see all the "red circles" correcting misspellings, bad grammar or run-on sentences.

But who...what...when...why...how come is really the foundation for knowledge, information and understanding in our lives. That true in day- to-day life. It's what gets the job done. It's true in our spiritual life. God wants us to have His information, which gives us knowledge, wisdom and understanding of this life and the life that is to come.

This year 2017 is the 500th Anniversary of the Lutheran Reformation. God used Dr. Martin Luther to uncover the truths of Scripture and to translate the Bible into the language of ordinary people (German at the time of Luther) so that truths of God's Word could be read by everyone. This was revolutionary! People believed the Bible was too complicated and deep for ordinary people. The invention of the printing press changed all of that. Martin Luther put that invention to good use by translating Scriptures into German. Suddenly the Bible was in the hands of everyone! Suddenly everyone could understand the "who, what, when, why's and how come's" of God's Word. It turned the world upside down. And the Bible translated into hundreds of different languages, continues to be the Number 1 best-seller.

But something has happened! God's Word is being lost. Not because it is forbidden to be read or publishers no longer publish it but simply because people don't take the time to read it. Maybe it's because we swamped with too much information; too many commitments to handle or we think we learned enough in Sunday School or Catechism days. Whatever the reason...look at Jesus' Word: "Search the Scriptures, they bear witness about Me." He wants us to know more. He wants us to grow in His grace and knowledge our whole life long. (II Peter 3:18). There is a part of us that knows we should be doing that! But the struggle to keep up, to deal with change, to stay one-step ahead is more fierce than ever! Isn't there something we can cling to that doesn't change? (Hebrews 13:8) Isn't there something that will give us security? (Matthew 11:28-30)

That's why *The St. Paul Lutheran Summer Bible Reading Challenge* is your opportunity. It's an opportunity individually as believers and collectively as a congregation. That opportunity is God-given knowledge, wisdom and

understanding as we read His Word. It will help you in your life, your family and our congregation. You have God's Word on it! (Isaiah 55:11)

How *The Summer Bible Reading Challenge* works is every member is free to pick up a bookmark sheet by the display table in the fellowship area. That means everyone! (Children, young people and adults) The sheet contains three book-markers for June-July-August. Simply fill out the Chapters or Books of the Bible that you have read on the book marker during that month and then drop it into the box marked for that month.

Take the time to tear off the tab with the Luther seal and keep it for the drawing later on. Each book marker and tear off tab is numbered. Please note: **THIS PROGRAM IS COMPLETELY ANONYMOUS! No names, addresses or phone numbers are needed at all!** All that will be done with the turned in book markers is that they will be recorded on the display so that we can see what Books of the Bible are being read by the congregation month by month.

By now you're thinking, "Pastor, I don't really like to read"... so...I think I will pass."

That's not really as big a problem as you may think. You can download the Bible through the internet or apps and listen to it. The goal of the program is NOT to skim, race or speed read through as many books but rather to read and think about the chapter or book of the Bible that you are reading. If there are words or phrases that you don't understand or want more information about; use a "Study Bible"; speak with Pastor or if all else fails "Google" that word or phrase to learn more about it.

So where will you begin? That is entirely up to you!!! The back of the *Reformation Summer Bible Reading Challenge* has a schedule of readings that can be used for a whole year or can be divided up as you would like for this three month challenge.

To wrap this up, by way of review...Who is Needed? You are needed! Why is this needed? Jesus wants us to search the Scripture so we can be sure of our salvation. What is needed? A Bible and a prayerful heart that wants to learn. Where and When? Reading happens in home. Reading happens as you ride in a car and listen. Reading happens when you put it on your smartphone and listen while you exercise, when you are out on the water fishing. Simply make the time and take the time where and when it works for you! How come? Because God's hand of blessing rest with those who hear and listen to His Word. (Like 11:28)

To close, it all comes down to three things: 1] Pick up a Reformation Bible Challenge Sheet and Book Marker Sheet. 2] Ask for God's help and blessing and begin to read/ listen to the Bible. 3] Each month record what you have read on the book marker. Tear off the tab with the seal and hang on to it. Put the book marker in the box for that month.

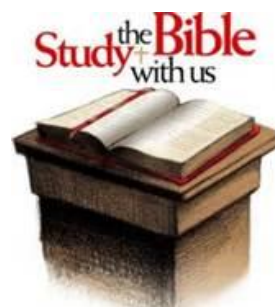
Special Summer Bible Reading Challenge

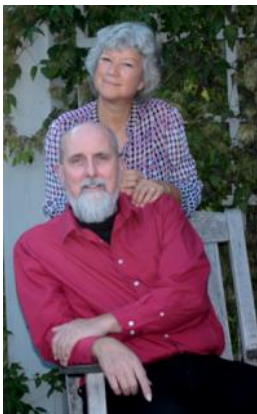
New Seamless Gutter Installation

Pastor opened with a devotion.

Roll Call: Matthew Voigt, Bob Wendt, Pastor Pope, Sandy Smith, Mark Peters, Kirk Delwiche, Phil Lewin, Ken Rothe, Scott Krause, Doug Ehrenberg, Paul Krause, Bobbi Marks.

Absent: Stewardship/Evangelism

Minutes: The minutes of the March meeting were reviewed. A motion was made by Scott Krause, seconded by Ken Rothe to approve. Motion Carried.

Treasurer: The March treasurers report was reviewed. A quarterly statement from our LCMS Foundation investments was noted as having performed well over the past three month. The Camp Luther fund increased by \$156.50, Westmeyer increases by \$125.41, and the Neuschafer increased by \$724.71. A motion was made by Ken Rothe, seconded by Scott Krause to approve. Motion Carried.

Pastor: Examination is this Sunday. The first Sunday in May is confirmation. There will be two upcoming funerals. Betty Martin, grandmother of Michelle Berndt is this Saturday at Lewins. Then on May 20th a memorial service for Jan Mead will be at Lewins. April 29th is the Beilfuss/Gabriliska Wedding in Green Bay. We are looking to replace the current guest registration stand with money from a memorial gift. Dave Horn has been contacted to see if he would be willing to do another outdoor worship service with us in July.

Elders: Service times were discussed for 2017. They discussed having two Christmas Eve Services. One at 4:30 and one at 6:30. Still looking for ushers and greeters for late service.

Trustees: Cleanup day was April 1st. Cleaned out the garage. The garage will need new siding and door replacement soon. Scott will be meeting with somebody about the gutters on the church tomorrow. Flooring will be started Monday. Painting needs to get done in the offices before flooring installation. Scott thinks the estimate for new siding/soffit and garage doors will be about \$4500. Scott will take mower and service it for the summer.

Board of Education: Daycare budget is doing well. They have received a \$500 county grant to do container gardening with the kids this summer. The Way is looking into a Mother's Day plant sale. Sunday school children will sing on confirmation Sunday. The annual film fest has been scheduled for Friday August 4th.

Stewardship/Evangelism: None Present. They are working on Usher/Greeter list.

Old Business:

Redecorating: Flooring is scheduled to begin on Monday. The recent fundraiser for this project was well received and raised almost \$4000.00. Kim submitted a quote for new office furniture. About \$450.00 has been left as part of a memorial. Total cost is about \$1800. A motion was made by Bobbi Marks, seconded by Scott Krause to approve the furniture purchase and take the balance left from the memorial fund. Motion Carried. An example of a custom made picture board was shown. It would work very well in our space vs a premade wall or free standing one. Doug would like to table this until next month.

Christmas Service Times: It was agreed that two Christmas Eve services was not the way to go. There is still a general disagreement about what time that service should be, 4:30 or 6:30. A motion was made by Mark Peters, seconded by Scott Krause to have one Sunday morning service on December 24th at 9 am and one Christmas Eve Service at 4:30 pm. Motion carried with one Nay by Matthew Voigt.

New Business:

Posters: Sandy wanted to know if the church would be willing to hang posters about Drug and Alcohol abuse in teenagers that is being presented at our schools. Council agreed this would be ok.

New Years' Service: It is recommended that we have regular Sunday service times on New Year's Eve. Motion by Bobbi Marks, seconded by Bob Wendt to approve. Motion Carried.

A motion was made by Bobbi Marks, seconded by Scott Krause to adjourn. We adjourned at 7:35 pm.

We closed with the Lord's Prayer.
