

From Pastor's Pen ...



"Everyone then who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock. And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on the rock. And everyone who hears these words of mine and does not do them will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand. And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell, and great was the fall of it."

(Matthew 7:24-27)

Where Your Foundation Is

The Blizzard of '18 will certainly give everyone something to talk about in years to come. Along with the Blizzard of 1999 and the Blizzard of 1967. What? You ask. Don't remember them? Those were all major blizzards that hit the Midwest. The trouble is, we don't. Unless you actually experienced them, you remember. Other than that, it becomes a news item, a photo or a topic of conversation in years ahead filed under "remember when?".

Events like these disappear in the rearview mirror; don't they? But for some the effects still linger on. Besides sore backs and big grass divets from the snow plows; there are collapsed roofs, flooded basements and rising rivers. For some it's devastating! Muddy floors, moldy walls and cherished possessions headed for a dumpster. The work of a lifetime lost in a matter of hours.

In this passage from Matthew's Gospel, Jesus talks about location to avoid destruction. But Jesus' purpose is more than just a contractor's eye for site location. He has more in mind than just telling a story about a person who liked lake front/ocean front prop-erty only to find

heartbreak in the end. He wants us to think carefully about the foundation on which we are building our lives. Just as a well-constructed/ engineered roof can handle the weight & drain tile will preserve a foundation; so also His words and promises are the foundation our lives have to be built on.

Why? Life storms will hit. The unexpected will strike. That's the reality of this world not because that's just the way life is but because it is the reality of sin. It's not a matter of "if" but "when". The trouble is we live in a society and a culture that maintains everything has to be happy and carefree. Yet the reality of sin hits daily. It strikes like a ton of bricks. People try to medicate it, pretend it doesn't exist or in despair take their own lives. But the Christian foundation, your foundation in Christ is different!

When illness or surgery robs of our health; we receive the strength to keep going that only God can provide. When financial worries/reversals threaten; Jesus still promises that He will give us "the daily bread" that we need. When our relationships are threatened by conflict/turmoil; we have the power to forgive that comes only from Jesus. When we are troubled by our own sins and guilt threatens to sweep us into despair; we are assured of the forgiveness that flows from our Savior's sacrifice on the Cross.

Where is this location, this rock to build our lives on? We find it in our Risen Savior, who ascended into heaven and sits at God's right hand with all power and authority. He promises that the tangle of sin we find ourselves in, He will unravel. He promises that the unexpected will not overwhelm us. When our lives are built on Christ — on a living and active relationship with Him — we receive the rock-like endurance to get through the toughest of times.

As the Pentecost season begins on May 20, 2018; we need the Holy Spirit to build us on Christ

the solid foundation. Any house that is going to stand the test of time needs the very best when it comes to a foundation. The same applies to our life. We aren't building for time. We are built for eternity. That is what the work of Christ has accomplished for you! Yes - it takes time and effort to open Bibles/Portals of Prayer each day and receive the comfort that God has for us in Christ. It takes effort to make sure the family is ready to go to church on Sunday mornings. But the Holy Spirit helps us to see the value in doing these things regularly and faithfully. We need the constant assurance of God's love and forgiveness in our lives filled with so much stress, guilt and anxiety. Hearing how Christ satisfied all of God's demands and willingly paid the price of every sin fills us with joy and wholeness in the midst of life's uncertainties.

So where is your life standing at the moment? Is it all about the shifting sands of this life? Building on sand is to see Christ and His Church as only the moments: baptisms, confirmations, weddings and funerals. Your spiritual life becomes nothing more than a "remember when" moment like photographs! Don't make Jesus into a passing thought. Your life in Christ is too valuable to let it fade and vanish! Your life in Christ is to be experienced day by day!

Build on the solid rock of Jesus Christ. Commit yourself to regularly hear God's Word for yourself and your family even as summer comes on the horizon. Grow in your understanding of God's love for you. Carve the time. Make the commitment. Your life in Christ is too important to dismiss as another detail of life because you are overbooked, overcommitted and overstressed to spend time with Christ at home and at church. Christ suffered, died and rose again so that you can be His own for time and eternity. As you do so...Be confident that the Holy Spirit is building you on the right place, the foundation, that is Christ the rock of your salvation.

Ushers & Greeters at St. Paul



Minutes: The February council minutes and the February special council minutes were reviewed. A motion was made by Phil Lewin, seconded by Mark Peters to approve. Motion carried.

Treasurer: We would like the operational budget to appear in the newsletter as well as the bulletin. An explanation will be given at the April quarterly meeting. A motion was made by Mark Peters, seconded by Phil Lewin to approve. Motion carried.

Pastor: The Gurgel family will be joining our church. This will be brought up at the quarterly meeting for approval. The Westmeyer Scholarship needs to meet and disperse scholarship money. The winter book festival is coming to an end. Holy Week begins next week.
