From Pastor's Pen ...



"Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." I Thessalonians 5:18

A news reporter once asked America's first billionaire, John D. Rockefeller, "how much money is enough?" "Just a little bit more," was Rockefeller's answer, "just a little bit more." When you hear that, you come to one of two conclusions. "Those Rockefellers were greedy old misers," (in other words, he's got more money than he knows what to do with)or "Rockefeller is an honest realist" (he is expressing what we all are thinking...even when you're rich, you need a little bit more). And don't we all find ourselves thinking that? Just a little bit more...how nice it would be, just to have a little bit more.

There's nothing wrong with financial security. But how much is enough? If you are pricing out a vacation home and feel frustrated that you won't have enough for a boat, the gator and all the rest of the things that come with a vacation home, that's one thing. But if you've lost your job or the jobs you have, aren't paying the bills and it's hard to put food on the table – that's quite another.

Sometimes, life has its share of challenges and issues. Sometimes it's hard to distinguish between actual needs with just plain old greed. Do you need a little bit more? Maybe...maybe not. Jesus once said: "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moth and rust do not destroy and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Matthew 6:19-21)

Rather than the constant struggle for having and getting; Jesus wants us to have peace. Rather than the stress of "never enough"; Jesus directs us to thanksgiving. Jesus' peace comes by taking a close look at the words He has taught us: "give us this day our daily bread". In the mad dash to secure

tomorrow's bread, we forget about the bread God has provided at the moment and the bread God has given us in the past. As the Holy Spirit helps us to see this God-given bread in our lives so easily taken for granted; then there is a spirit of thanksgiving that God will take care of the moment as well as our future.

Perhaps you're thinking... this peace is all fine and good but it won't pay the bills or put something away for retirement. How is that going to happen? God's answer is this...the same God who numbers the hairs on your head, who watches over the sparrows is the same faithful, loving God who watches over you. He tells us not to be afraid but to continue trust His Word, to continue to work with the strength that God provides and He will take care of our needs. According to our Savior, enormous time and energy is spent on investing in earthly security, instead of investing in spiritual security. In the end what happens? We leave it all behind.

That makes heaven the only worthwhile investment. And here's the best news: Jesus lived, died and rose again to give you that heavenly treasure that truly lasts. Peace with God now and peace with Him forevermore. This is the only gift that stands through time to all eternity.

Put your trust in Jesus and see the eternal treasure and security that you have in Him. What more is needed? God gives us real security through our Savior. And for this life and all our moments, the Lord still says, I will provide! We have His Word on it sealed in our Savior's death and resurrection. Instead of the constant worry, "What will we eat and what will we drink or what will we wear?...your heavenly Father knows! But seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness and all these things will be added to you." (Matthew 6:31-33) In Christ, we have every reason to give thanks! May Christ's blessing to us lead us to a lifetime of thanks!

News From Youth Group (The Way)



Minutes: The minutes of the August meeting were reviewed. A motion was made by Scott Krause and seconded by Bobbi Marks to approve. Motion carried.

Treasurer: The August treasurers report was reviewed. A motion was made by Phil Lewin, seconded by Mark Peters to approve. Motion carried.

Pastor: There are 17 students in catechism. The Sunday school kids will be singing at Oktoberfest and Reformation. A planning meeting will occur this coming Sunday at 9:15 am for Reformation Sunday. We have two new members, Ellsworth Koenamann and Louis Thorne. A motion was made by Bobbi Marks, seconded by Phil Lewin to accept these new members. Motion carried. Oktoberfest is October 1st, we will only have one communion Sunday in October. Reformation Sunday there will only be one service at 9:30 am. The quarterly meeting will be October 22nd between services.

Elders: Elections will need to occur in October at the council meeting and at the quarterly meeting. There are six positions up for re-election. We will also review salaries at the October meeting. Garage doors have been donated for the garage here at church.

Trustees: Benches from the Kramer family have been ordered. Bob has offered to help set them up when they come. Covers for the window wells have been installed. The scrip safe needs addressing. Needs lighting and to be secured. Network cable has been run but it needs ends put on it. Bob is looking for additional ideas for a fenced in area on the parking lot for the daycare to use. Shrubs have been trimmed. Great Lakes roofing has been contacted about the roof leak.

Board of Education: The childcare budget is doing well. They are near capacity. Board of Ed. Is continuing to look at ways the daycare can contribute to the church. Sunday school has begun. Pastor is working on the Christmas program.

Stewardship/Evangelism: Reformation walk will be the last Sunday in October. They are continuing to plan for this event.

New Business:

Microsoft/Adobe Software: We have been looking into updating the church office software and purchasing a full version of adobe for some time. A suite of Microsoft office software cost about \$600 for one computer and the adobe software is about \$500 per license. After some research, because of our 501c3 status we qualify for donated software from both Microsoft and adobe. The cost per computer for a suite from Microsoft will cost \$29.00 and a copy of adobe will cost \$55.00. To outfit the four church computers with Microsoft office and Kim's computer with adobe the cost will be \$171.00. This small fee goes to pay for the administration of the software. A motion was made by Bobbi Marks, seconded by Bob Wendt to purchase the software and pay for it from our technology fund. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Bobbi Marks, seconded by Phil Lewin to adjourn. We adjourned at 7:30 pm.
