You Can Never Have Enough

On the southside of Appleton, along South River Road, near the locks by the Fox River is a labyrinth garden. A labyrinth is a circular path that eventually winds to the center. It is similar to a maze. What is interesting about this labyrinth is its reason for being constructed. The marker at the entrance explains: *“Labyrinths are sacred spaces. They have existed in every age and faith tradition to respond to the human need for meditation...walking on this winding path helps to quiet and empty your mind. The journey towards the center is a time for you to release your cares and concerns. You will become open to the present moment from which guidance can come.”*

Mindfulness is a popular buzz-word at the moment that a lot of people use to define “their spirituality”. What isn’t apparent is that “mindfulness” connects with a religious term called “sati” which is Buddhist. In Buddhist teachings, “mindfulness” is a practice to develop self-knowledge and wisdom so that you can know yourself and reach enlightenment. Enlightenment is the first step to rebirth and reincarnation so that you can reach Nibbana, ultimate happiness! And labyrinth gardens are just a part of this process of self-enlightenment. Trouble is, you have to walk in circles to find it.

Do you want to discover “the you” that is in you? That is an appealing premise! Who doesn’t want to kick some bad habits and become a better person? It just might make you feel better about yourself. And who doesn’t want that?

Mindfulness says all people are good and that bad choices and bad karma (your actions) get in the way. When people grow in self-awareness, they will naturally choose the good and get the good...living an enlightened life. The Scriptures, on the other hand, says that the “mystery of you” is not something for you to unlock...but rather a gift! A gift that is separate and apart from you. Let me explain.

God tells us that people are not basically good. Left to themselves people will not only make selfish choices but down-right evil choices. More than that, they will do it again and again; even when they apply their best efforts. As a result every human being is in the same boat. **“there is no one who understands, no one who seeks God, the way of peace they do not know.”**

Everyone has a hard time getting their heads around the reality of evil and what it really means. But instead of dismissing it...give it some thought. The account of Adam and Eve isn’t just one of many “mythic tales” that you can choose to believe or ignore. It is our reality. What they did has affected us. The more, Adam and Eve thought about life where they became God (knowing good and evil) the easier it was to eat from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil. But this life of “self-knowledge and self-improvement” led to trouble, misery and death. To pursue knowledge of “you” apart from God will only lead to death.

Jesus knows that we lack not only real knowledge of ourselves but true knowledge of God apart from ourselves (the Gift). We don’t find/discover/realize this knowledge of ourselves on our own. God gives us knowledge about ourselves and more importantly about Him through the Bible. His divinely inspired Word! We become wise for salvation through the Word of God just like Paul wrote to Timothy (II Timothy 3:15). The salvation that God has is the Gift. The Gift of His Son Jesus Christ. He did two things: He pleased God perfectly by doing the Will of God perfectly in our place. He died the death that our sins and the world’s sins deserve and rose victorious over sin and the grave.

Announcements and Upcoming Events

This knowledge you won't find walking in circles, meditating or even thinking hard and long. God's Word always points us to Christ. The verses at the very beginning tells us that God did all the hard thinking in our place. He knows how wide/long/high His love is! This love never fails. This love is unending. This love is beyond our human understanding. But this love of God is ours for the taking!

And that is the important point we need to remember. We need this love again and again in our lives. It needs to be a part of our lives regularly and continually. You can never have enough of this wonderful love of God in Christ. Without it you will only be walking in circles. Instead of trying to figure out how God feels about you...look to Christ. He shows you how He feels. He poured out His life for you so that you can have life. If you think that God is far removed from your life, look at your baptism. That is the connection between you and Christ. With Christ you have absolutely everything!

The point is simply this: be connected and stay connected. You can never have enough when it comes to Christ! With Christ, the walking in circles stops! You know who you are and where you are headed through Christ.








Adult Bible Classes for '18-'19

July 17, 2018

The meeting was called to order by Doug Ehrenberg at 6:32 pm.

Pastor opened with a devotion.

Roll: Matthew Voigt, Pastor Pope, Doug Ehrenberg, Ken Rothe, Bob Wendt, Paul Krause, Phil Lewin, Sandy Smith, Bobbi Marks.

Absent: Stewardship/Evangelism, Board of Education.

Minutes: Motion by Bobbi Marks, seconded by Phil Lewin to approve the June 2018 council minutes. Motion carried.

Treasurer: Motion by Phil Lewin, seconded by Paul Krause to approve the June 2018 Treasurer report. Motion carried.

Pastor: A lot of events are coming up in the next few months. July 15th was worship in the park, July 18th is the Timber Rattler outing, July 22nd is the quarterly meeting, August 10th is 4th annual film fest, August 11th is the Kohl wedding, August 12th is the Hasse/Rasmussen Baptism, September 9th is Sunday school kick off, September 16th starts the membership data review, September 15th is the Harfield wedding, and October 14th is Oktoberfest. Looking ahead another winter book festival is being planned. Larry and Barb Marquardt are seeking membership here. Motion by Phil Lewin, seconded by Bobbi Marks to approve. Motion carried. Pastor will be out of town the last Sunday in July and first Sunday in August.

Elders: Discussed the safety survey. Looking to add a few additional fire extinguishers to the building, as well as some multi dressing first aid kits. We will need to review where current extinguishers are and then place the new ones accordingly. Motion by Bobbi Marks, seconded by Paul Krause to look into getting the extinguishers and first aid kits. Motion carried.

Trustees: Painted the picnic table, and rebuilt one of the carts used for Oktoberfest. Painted around the new smaller dispensers that were installed by Cintas. Having trouble getting someone to give a quote on asphalt for the parking lot.

Board of Education: Daycare budget is about even. Daycare will need to look into cleaning services. Paul Krause presented the survey results from the strategic planning committee. Family movie night is coming up in August. Planning is going well and they are prepared for the event.

Stewardship/Evangelism: They helped plan and organize the worship in the park on July 15th. They went over the results of the strategic planning survey with Paul Krause and are looking into how they can help implement some of the ideas that came from that.

Old Business:

Strategic Planning: Paul met with various committees and went over results and discussed how each board can do their part in meeting the goals and ideas that have come forth.

New Business:

Change the Locks on the Building: There is a feeling that there are too many keys for the building out there. Before we make a decision we should see what the cost to this is. Given our safety survey it might be better for us to wait to see what changes might be made to the door systems. Doug is going to look into cost of lock change, but council agreed that we should table this until we know what changes might be made with the doors.

Health Plan: We need to select our health plan for the upcoming year. Concordia will be discontinuing the existing plans and moving to three new ones. However, we can elect to stay on our existing plan, but this will likely only be for another year or two. We currently only have one daycare employee on the plan. Council will table this matter until Matthew can talk to that employee and also meet with the board of the education so that know what the plans and costs are.

Cleaning: Our current cleaning company will be quitting at the end of July. We will be in need of someone to clean the church starting in August. Nan Young would be interested. On a trial basis council agrees to have Nan Young clean the church at her current pay rate. Motion by Bobbi Marks, seconded by Phil Lewin to have Nan Young clean on a trial basis. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Bobbi Marks, seconded by Phil Lewin to adjourn. We adjourned at 7:50 pm.
